#### **24 – 4017 Cherrywood – Christine Terrell // Adaptive Reuse**

Recycled tin jewelry, with visiting artists. Good gift opportunities.

Laser wood engraving bird mobiles.

#### **77-85 – 701 Tillery – Tillery Studios**

Various artists including a letterpress card shop, painters, stained glass, jewelry, photography, mixed media, leather book binding, & furniture.

A great opportunity to see a bunch of artists at one stop.

#### **89 – 3304 Neal Street – Joseph Swec Sign Panting**

Hand painted sign work for the graphic design and typography nerds.

#### **91 – 916 Springdale - Blue Genie**

Commercial art fabricators that use a variety of materials to make incredible, large scale sculptures. Think the storks at the Domain, the Squirrel selling pecans along highway 71, the robots that sell tickets at the Drafthouse, and much more.

#### **97 – 5305 Bolm Road – Big Medium**

The home of East Austin Studio Tour - Lots of artist studios in an old warehouse – lots of variety of artists, with a slight bent towards fine art (not as many crafters). Lots of other group studios within walking distance of Big Medium.

#### **105-108 – 1406 Smith Road – Smith Road Studios**

Another group of studios, this one featuring some larger scale sculpture and cement work, glass, and paintings.

### **116-117 – 702 Shady Lane – Pump Project**

Home to dozens of talented artists, Pump Project features artist studios and a gallery space. Highlights include Debra Broz's quirky ceramics, mixed media by Mark Johnson, and a bunch of other great stuff.

### **119 – 4704 East Cesar Chavez Street – Art Post**

Yet another group studio site – many great visual artists, jewelry fabricators, a screenprinting shop, a company that makes audio electronics for musicians, and more.

### **122-128 – 4705 East 5<sup>th</sup> Street – Various Woodworkers**

A great stop to find incredible woodworking, everything from small scale candle holders up to enormous conference room tables. Beautiful and creative interpretations of an age old craft.

### **132-137 – 618 Tillery – Furniture and Screenprinting**

A handful of very talented woodworkers, metal fabricators, and a screenprinting shop.

### **140 – 2710 East Cesar Chaves – Ryan McKerley & Guests**

Ceramics artist McKerley always shows his best work and invites some of his most creative friends to his studio for E.A.S.T. Ceramics, paintings, metalsmithing, planters, and more.

### **146-149 – 507 Calles Street – Various Artists**

Home to a glassblowing studio, a circus arts collective, and a brewery, this is a fun stop. Guest artists include jewelers, painters, a furniture maker, and others.

### **177 – 1209 East 6<sup>th</sup> Street – Clayworks Studio**

An incredible ceramics studio – focus on tile and innovative pottery. Great gift opportunities (unique pizza stones, trivets, etc.). Host to a bunch of great artists including a mosaic tile artist and painter.

### **181 – 1200 East 2<sup>nd</sup> Street – Fisterra Studio**

Probably my all time favorite E.A.S.T. stop – a home studio of the local abstract and sculpture artist Jennifer Chenoweth. Her home is a work of art in itself, and she always does amazing staging highlighting a variety of guests. Visiting artists this year include a succulent garden designer, a recycled wood furniture maker, ceramicists, and painters.
